Build Muscles in TLI's Fitness Class

Building on last year's success, T.L.I. is offering Weight Training/Fitness this year for students who want to enjoy working out and learning new facts on health.

Mr. Kelsey, last year's Weight Training teacher, is continuing to teach it for all students interested. Ms. Ferrini will also be assisting Mr. Kelsey and teaching the class new stretches along with cardio exercises.

Each class is on Monday and Wednesday from 4:00p.m. to 5:00p.m. In the period of time that we have class we stretch to prepare our muscles to lift. When we finish stretching we split the class and have four students in the weight room with Mr. Kelsey and four students with Ms. Ferrini doing cardio.

In order to lose weight, you need to learn about nutrition and how it affects your weight loss and muscle gain. While you take Weight Training you will learn about healthy food and which type of food that could threaten your weight loss. You will learn about muscles and what exercises train each muscle along with how not to strain or tear them to keep you injury free.

Q: Do you like teaching at this school?

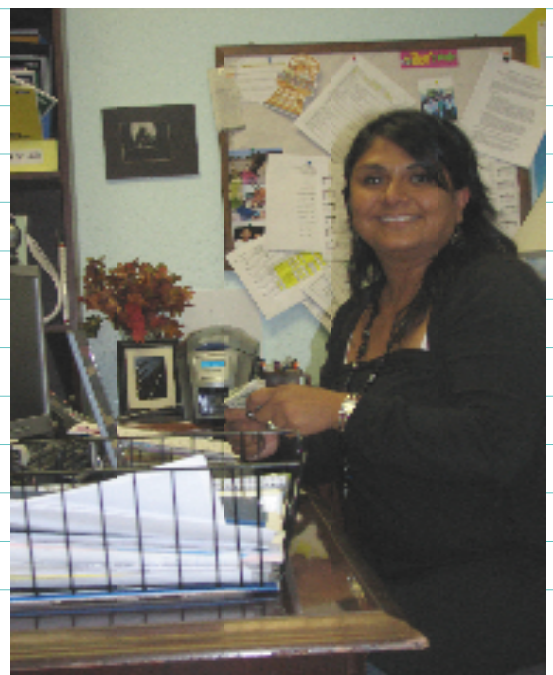
A: "I love my job!"
